The church in Acts looks different from our own in many ways. The church meets in the large homes of wealthy church members. Their services begin with a meal. They still consider themselves to be of the Jewish faith. The list goes on. One way that the church remains the same however is through the sacrament of communion: the eucharist.

Eucharist comes from the Greek word *eucharisteo*, meaning thanksgiving. We give thanks at the Lord's table. We are thankful for the gift of Christ's body and blood shed on the cross for the love of the world. We give thanks for the gift of the community of Christ that exists today, lifted into Jesus's presence by the mysterious power of the Holy Spirit. We express thanks for the feast that is to come when Christ returns in glory.

The communion table is not the only place to give thanks, particularly in this season. Here are some ideas for how you may express your gratitude to God this November:

- Keep a gratitude journal. Write a letter to God each night with a list of what you are grateful for that particular day.
- Share gratitude at the table. Whether at breakfast or dinner, incorporate gratitude into your prayer. Name one thing that you are thankful for at that moment.
- Write thank you notes. Make a practice each day, or on Sunday's, of writing thank you notes to people who've been kind to you.
- Turn off the radio in your car. Use that time to pray a prayer of thanksgiving.

We have more to be grateful for than we know, and gratitude is at the heart of the Christian life. I look forward to celebrating Thanksgiving with you on **Sunday, November 13** at our Thanksgiving banquet, and celebrating God's blessings together.







Sunset Hills Book Club MEETING IN PERSON November Book of the Month (Chapters 1 – 40) All Creatures Great & Small By James Herriot November 30th - 7:30 pm



For over forty years, generations of readers have thrilled to Herriot's marvelous tales, deep love of life, and extraordinary storytelling abilities. For decades, Herriot roamed the remote, beautiful Yorkshire Dales, treating every patient that came his way from smallest to largest, and observing animals and humans alike with his keen, loving eye.

In All Creatures Great and Small, we meet the young Herriot as he takes up his calling and discovers that the realities of veterinary practice in rural Yorkshire are very different from the sterile setting of veterinary school. Some visits are heart-wrenchingly difficult, such as one to an old man in the village whose very ill dog is his only friend and companion, some are lighthearted and fun, such as Herriot's periodic visits to the overfed and pampered Pekinese Tricki Woo who throws parties and has his own stationery, and yet others are inspirational and enlightening, such as Herriot's recollections of poor farmers who will scrape their meager earnings together to be able to get proper care for their working animals. From seeing to his patients in the depths of winter on the remotest homesteads to dealing with uncooperative owners and critically ill animals, Herriot discovers the wondrous variety and never-ending challenges of veterinary practice as his humor, compassion, and love of the animal world shine forth. 
