Music Notes By Shelby Gracey

As I write this, we're preparing for our first Sunday service back in our sanctuary on October 18, after seven long months of being away. Our Campanile Bell Choir is excited to play for worship on our first Sunday back, as well as a few more times throughout the remainder of the Fall season!

As we celebrate All Saints Day on November 1, I'd like to reflect on the meaning of this day.

"Someone has described a "saint" as any Christian who makes it easier for others to believe in God. One of the neglected liturgical days in many Protestant churches is All Saints Day, which occurs on the first Sunday in November. This neglect is understandable because the tradition of the day is rooted in medieval Catholicism. Homage is given on this day to the departed canonized saints of the church.

"There is, however, an underlying meaning to this day that evangelical Christians should use and recognize. Here, for example, are some lessons it can teach us.

- Every believer whom God has called by His grace and sanctified by His Spirit has been called to sainthood.
- We should thankfully remember those believers from our local church who were called to their heavenly home during the past year.
- We can thank God for that one particular individual who has especially influenced our lives – directing us to God, tutoring us in truth, and modeling the virtues of the Christian life.



"Bishop William W. How wrote the text of "For All the Saints" in 1864, for use in the Anglican church liturgy commemorating "All Saints Day."

"How do we best honor the memory of loved ones and friends who have contributed to our lives? By rededicating our own life to God, obeying Him implicitly, and reaching out to the needs of others."

(The hymn was originally written with eight verses, but the following four verses appear in our Presbyterian Hymnal.)

For all the Saints who from their labors rest, who thee by faith before the world confessed,

Thy name, O Jesus, be forever blest. Alleluia, Alleluia.

Thou art our rock, our fortress, and our might; Thou, Lord, our captain in the well-fought fight;

Thou, in the darkness drear, our one true light. Alleluia, Alleluia.

O blest communion, fellowship divine, we feebly struggle, they in glory shine; yet all are one in thee, for all are thine. Alleluia, Alleluia.

From earth's wide bounds, from ocean's farthest coast, through gates of pearl streams in the countless host; Singing to Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. Alleluia, Alleluia.

Children's Footprints... By Barb Clark

We have much to be thankful for these days, even amid a pandemic. "O Lord, my God, when I in awesome wonder, consider all the worlds, Thy hands have made. I see the stars, I hear the rolling thunder, Thy power throughout the universe displayed." (How Great Thou Art)

Let us go in a slightly different direction for a moment; you may want to grab your Bible.

In the 13th chapter of the Gospel of John, Jesus starts the evening at the table with his disciples, at this point what happens? Read verses 1-7. Okay, now, move over into Luke's Gospel 22:24-27, now, jump back into John's Gospel. Remember they were all there, they all experienced what just happened. We see an action of complete and utter love and gratitude from Jesus despite the bickering that was taking place. I imagine Jesus bending down, heart broken and saddened that they still did not get it - but loving them anyway as he washed their feet.

Can you feel Jesus in this moment? As he moves from foot to foot: from disciple to disciple, I imagine him praying for each one of them. "Father comfort Peter when the cock crows the third time. And Judas, Father, please not Judas!" Maybe he even asked why? "But Father if it is your will, please forgive them for they know not what......" Praying for each of them, an intimate moment of love and gratitude for the disciples. And I also believe, that the memory of the Lord stooping before them washing their feet and the feeling of peace he bestowed on each of them, would be used as a great source of comfort and gratitude throughout their ministry.

Fast forward......three days had passed and in the Upper Room the disciples while frightened, were remembering, this may have been the first time they became thankful for all that Jesus had done for them to include when he bent down and washed their feet. THIS, they could hold onto for the rest of their lives. Thankful!

Thankfulness and Gratitude are topics of conversation as we enter the Fall season. As we prepare our hearts for the season of thankfulness, what does that look like in your life? What could you blurt out loud that you are thankful for? Do it, shout it, then say another and another, keep yourself going until maybe tears stream down your face. Let it sink in and then be grateful for it all, the good, the bad and the ugly. Without those other pieces of the puzzle you would not even know what thankful looked like and would not even recognize it if it stood before you.

Jesus said "My peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you, I do not give peace to you as the world gives." And then......


The gift of the Holy Spirit, the peace that transcends! Hallelujah! Praise God from whom all Blessings flow!

Syria's Secret Library by Mike Thomson

Daraya lies on the fringe of Damascus, just southwest of the Syrian capital. Yet for four years it lived in another world. Besieged by government forces early in the Syrian Civil War, its people were deprived of food, bombarded by heavy artillery, and under the constant fire of snipers. But deep beneath this scene of frightening devastation lay a hidden library. While the streets above echoed with shelling and rifle fire, the secret world below was a haven of books.

Long rows of well-thumbed volumes lined almost every wall: bloated editions with grand leather covers, pocket-sized guides to Syrian poetry, and no-nonsense reference books, all arranged in well-ordered lines. But this precious horde was not bought from publishers or loaned by other libraries--they were the books salvaged and scavenged at great personal risk from the doomed city above.


Sunset Hills Nursery School
