A Message from Pastor Laura

Then Moses led Israel from the Red Sea and they went into the wilderness. For three days they traveled in the desert without finding water.

– Exodus 15:22-23



We are not the first to pass this way. Nor shall we be the last. Like the Israelites rejoicing as they crossed the Red Sea, it was only six weeks ago that we rejoiced at our Lenten Dinner with a Purpose. Homemade desserts lined the table. Delicious food filled our bellies. Conversation echoed off Findley Hall’s walls. This joy came without our knowing that it would be our last time together for over two months.

We learn from the Exodus that others have experienced similar sorrow. One minute, Miriam is dancing with a tambourine. The next minute the Israelites are almost dead from lack of water. Though the Israelites do not know it, their wilderness journey will continue on for four decades. Only two out of the thousands upon thousands of people who left Egypt will survive to see the Land of Promise. (For those who are interested, the two who survive are Caleb and Moses’ brother, Aaron.) Our ancestors understand what we’re feeling.

We learn from the Exodus, second, that God never leaves God’s people alone in these feelings. **God does not leave us alone in exile.** Though it may be strange to call it exile, since we are all actually quite stuck at home, this is an exile. We are exiled from our church families, church building, friends, families, playgrounds, places of joy, places of refuge, places of familiarity. God is present to us in this. As the Lord provides water for the Israelites, provides a light for them at night, provides food for them in the morning, so are we provided for by our God.

Unlike the Israelites, it would be wise that we put our trust in this God! Do not panic – do not despair – but trust!

In the coming weeks, as we continue to worship and study from home, we will do so with the story of Moses. Please join us for Sunday School at 9:00 a.m. and worship at 10:15 a.m. Let’s discover together what Moses’s story has to say for our story today.

The Lord be with you now and forever more.

However, once again - I had no ability to make that music



accessible to everyone. Enter Ryan again, who did the magic of combining the audio and PowerPoint files that I sent him into a video that could be posted to the SHUP Music YouTube channel he created for our online service music. My "tech smarts" could take me only so far in today's online world, and I had to reach out for help to make it work correctly.

And speaking of tech smarts, Dave Petty, Keith Yanda and Ryan each recorded their own musical track at home and then they put it all together into a virtual trio of "Morning Has Broken" that was shared for our morning worship on April 19. Looking forward to more of their music to come!

Everyone has had to adjust their way of working through this pandemic – Laura with her online messages and devotions; Barb with her Sunday School and & youth group virtual gatherings; Karin with compiling the

bulletins and sending the congregation the links to access the services; and Karen keeping our finances in order, as people are learning how to give online.

If this crisis has taught us anything, I believe one of the most important lessons I'll take away from this time is that we need to lean on each other – to ask for help when we need it – and to offer help when we can give it. Let's hope that this lesson will continue to apply to everyone long after this crisis has passed!

You might ask, "Have I decided to get a smart phone now?" Well, the jury's still out on that decision!

Update from Session

Session sends its greetings. We hope this message finds SHUP members and friends healthy and safe. As Pastor Laura announced in her virtual service posted on April 26th, Session decided at its April 22nd meeting that the SHUP building will remain closed throughout May.

We are all anxious to join together in worship again in person. But given how much we have yet to learn about this disease, Session is taking a slow, careful approach to reopening our building. Although Governor Wolf's current stay-at-home order expires May 8th, we don't know yet when we will be cleared to resume live worship services.

The governor has said some parts of the state may be released from the

order before others. It's also possible activities will be phased in gradually, with large public gatherings most likely be one of the last on the list. It also seems highly likely health officials will recommend social distancing even after large gatherings resume.

Session is currently forming a Re-Entry Team that will create a plan for cleaning and sanitizing the church before the building re-opens. The team will also create a plan for adapting our worship as needed to help keep us all healthy. Over the past few years, it's been our habit to change things up a bit for summer worship, and this year will be no exception. The team will be using guidance from both the presbytery and from local public health officials in creating our plan.

We hope to see all of you soon. In the meantime, please join us as we continue our online worship. Pastor Laura's service is posted on YouTube each Sunday, with special music and readings. You are also invited to join her live on Zoom for Sunday school. For a complete schedule of online events, please see SHUP's Friday email. If you are in need of pastoral care or other support while the building is closed, please contact the church office.

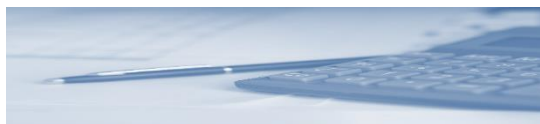
I try not to watch any television if I can help it and check on the news only every few days.
