A Message from Pastor Laura



The Lord's Supper. Communion. Eucharist. Which word do you use to describe the sacrament? It doesn't really matter. Every one of them is an accurate name, and every one of them shows a different facet of the sacrament we celebrate. The Lord's Supper reminds us that the sacrament is founded by Jesus - one of the key requirements in the Reformed tradition

for a sacrament. Jesus creates this sacrament, instituting the practice and inviting his disciples to continue the practice after his death, resurrection, and ascension. Echoes of this sacrament take place in the meal following the Emmaus journey, in the breakfast on the beach, and in the celebration of the sacrament throughout the book of Acts. The words, "The Lord's Supper," reminds us that this comes to us from Jesus, and he is our host.

Communion teaches us that this sacrament is for the community of Christ. The community of Christ includes those gathered in the room literally partaking of the bread and the cup. Additionally, the community includes the church around the world and the church that has already gone up into heaven. The sacrament is a unifying force in the midst of the church's differences, holding us all together in Christ Jesus.

Eucharist, my personal favorite term, means "thanksgiving." It comes from the Greek words for thanksgiving, *eucharistea*. The sacrament is a table and communion of thanksgiving, giving thanks for the death and resurrection of Jesus. We give thanks at the table for the new life we receive in him, a life defined by compassion, mercy, grace, hope, peace, joy, and love. We give

thanks that Jesus is with us by the power of the Holy Spirit, and that that same Spirit lifts us into Christ's presence every time we partake of the bread and the cup. We give thanks that the community of Christ is one, even as God is one, united in similarities and celebratory in our differences.

As we approach this cultural time of Thanksgiving, we have much to be grateful for. To quote the Psalmist, our cup runneth over. Thanks be to God for Jesus, thanks be to God for one another, and thanks be to God for the sacrament we celebrate.

Getting to Know Taylor...Better

Do you have any special memories/moments from your time at SHUP?

I have so many memories of SHUP, that it is hard for me to pick favorites. I remember being excited to go to SHUP every Wednesday for youth group because it was my safe place and I missed my friends. I enjoyed many lock-ins and would make sure I was free to go to all of them. I was able to feel like a kid at SHUP, and that certainly is my favorite part.

What made you decide/convinced you to take this position?

I lost my relationship with my faith due to multiple traumatic experiences at 18 years old. As time went on, I was asked to join a Bible Study with two friends. That study became my first step into rediscovering my relationship with my faith. I missed being a child in those moments and how I learned about David and Goliath or how amazed I was to learn about the miracles that occurred. I decided to take this position because I want to give the youth at Sunset Hills the same feeling that I had in this church as a kid.

Do you have any special plans/ideas for new programs?

I would love to start an afterschool program for the middle to high school members and their friends. They could sign up to come to the church to do their homework together, listen to music, meet new friends or just relax. I think that it is important for our youth and the community to think of the church as a safe space. I would also like to have new youth join by holding a Date/Kids Night Club and open it up to everyone in the community. I would also like to get the youth involved in more volunteer programs like World Vision and other organizations. The one thing I would like to bring back is the high school handprint tradition.

Do you have a specific approach/philosophy for teaching children about the love of Jesus?

The main approach I am using for my teaching the love of Jesus is discipleship. I believe that it is important to teach children how to walk with Jesus and how to live by faith. I want children to think of their faith as a way to understand the world around them and how to treat others and themselves.

What are your hobbies or other interests?

I enjoy crocheting blankets and objects that resemble hats. While I am not very good, it is a really great way to relieve stress and connect with myself. I also enjoy writing and am working on my first novel.



With the same gutsy and poetic honesty that charmed readers around the world, Bunmi now




